- The Canosia Township Historical Society hosted an “Open House,” in conjunction with the annual Canosia Township picnic and get together in August.
- We worked with the SuperOne stores corporate office regarding the historical pictures displayed at the local SuperOne grocery store. Several pictures are now on display in the entryway of the store, as well as adjacent to the produce section.
- Archeologists Sue and Steve Mulholland donated their time to review, record, and photograph archeological artifacts in Town Hall. Sue and Steve are also members of the Historical Society.
- We applied film on windows to protect, preserve, and prevent deterioration of the U.S. flag, furnishings, and historical artifacts located in the Town Hall from UV rays.

- We purchased brass plaques to be attached to donated items in the Town Hall.
- We participated in work days held occasionally throughout the year to record, inventory, organize, label, and display historical items in the Town Hall.
